
Dominion Road School (1261) Enrolment Scheme

Home Zone

All students who live within the home zone <u>described below</u> and <u>shown on the attached map</u> shall be entitled to enrol at the school.

Starting at the intersection of Renfrew Avenue and Mt Albert Road, travel south east along both sides of Mt Albert Road (307-439, 320-508 included) to May Road. Travel south along the centre of May Road (32 and below, even numbers only included) and east along Memorial Drive to Winstone Road (11, 14 and below included; Mt Roskill Road addresses 27, 30 and below included). Travel north along Winstone Road to Mt Albert Road (Bremner Avenue addresses 47, 68 and above included). Travel east along both sides of Mt Albert Road to the intersection with Scout Avenue and Bremner Avenue. Continue east along the centre of Mt Albert Road to McCullough Avenue and travel north along McCullough Avenue to Duke Street (Smallfield Avenue and offroads included). Travel east along Duke Street, north along Mt Eden Road (925 only included) and west along Landscape Avenue (53, 54 and above included) to Dominion Road. Cross Dominion Road (823-1049, 926-1302 included) travel west along Invermay Road then south on Renfrew Avenue, back to the starting point.

All residential addresses on included sides of boundary roads and all no exit roads off included sides of boundary roads are included in the zone unless otherwise stated.

Proof of residence within the home zone will be required.

Each year, applications for enrolment in the following year from in-zone students will be sought by a date which will be published in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the area served by the school. This will enable the board to assess the number of places which can be made available to students who live outside the home zone.

Out of Zone Enrolments

Each year the board will determine the number of places which are likely to be available in the following year for the enrolment of students who live outside the home zone. The board will publish this information by notice in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the area served by the school. The notice will indicate how applications are to be made and will specify a date by which all applications must be received.

Applications for enrolment will be processed in the following order of priority:

First Priority This priority category is not applicable at this school because the school does not run a

special programme approved by the Secretary

Second Priority will be given to applicants who are siblings of current students.

Third Priority will be given to applicants who are siblings of former students.

Fourth Priority will be given to any applicant who is a child of a former student of the school.

Fifth Priority will be given to any applicant who is either a child of an employee of the board of the

school or a child of a member of the board of the school.

Sixth Priority will be given to all other applicants.

If there are more applicants in the second, third, fourth, fifth or sixth priority groups than there are places available, selection within the priority group will be by a ballot conducted in accordance with instructions issued by the Secretary under Section 11G(1) of the Education Act 1989. Parents will be informed of the date of any ballot by notice in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the area served by the school.

Applicants seeking second or third priority status may be required to give proof of a sibling relationship.
